

Verdi is alive with the sound of eating and opera

s I nibbled on tender little O-rings of squid, a tenor began to sing a medley of favorites by Gershwin. By the time I got to the *agnolotti* stuffed with spinach swimming in a very Northern Italian cream sauce, a bass-baritone had meandered his way to Cole Porter. And as I dug into a neatly grilled lamb chop (with such a musical name — valtelline d'agnello grigliate alle erbe), the darker tones of Kurt Weill were echoing throughout the room.

It was not, as you might suspect: a clandestine meeting of the Enrico Caruso Marching and Chowder Benevolent Society and Ladies Auxiliary. Nor was it Luciano Pavarotti's birthday. Instead, it was just an average run-of-the-mill night at L.A.'s pre-eminent opera restaurant, Verdi, which. after three years of wine, men and women and song, is still as fresh and fun as the day it opened.

One of the most extraordinary things about Verdi is its lack of restrictions of people showing up for music. Not long ago, after dinner at Trader Vic's (which is basically attached to the side of the Beverly Hilton), I tried to meander upstairs for a cocktail and a little dancing at L'Escoffier Room. Sorry, I was told, the dance floor is for dinner patrons only. But at Verdi, I've never been turned away, neither when I've shown up just for a drink at the bar (I should add, the very popular and crowded bar, which is often standing-room-only), nor when I've shown up after a meal at a nearby rve shown up ancer a mear at a nearby restaurant, hoping to get dessert and a show for the same price. In fact, the first time I ever dropped by Verdi was on a Saturday night about two years ago I was in a party of four, it was about 10 o'clock and the place was packed. I told them that we only wanted drinks — and to my amazement, they sat us not in the bar, but at the only remaining table in the center of the restaurant. They didn't do this because I was a restaurant critic, since I was my usual anonymous self. They did this because the people who run Verdi are smarter

than the average restaurant owners, and realize that a little good will goes a very

If you go there for dinner, what you can expect is some solid, highly satisfying and generally non-trendy Northern Italian cooking. There are no exotic pizzas here, no radicchio topped with broiled scamorza cheese, no ravioli filled with raspberries. Instead, the food is fairly straight antipasto misto looks a lot like the antipasto misto served in any of a dozen good, old-line Italian restaurants. Linguine comes topped with either red or white clam sauce. Tortellini are filled with ricotta cheese and spinach. then moistened with a walnut sauce. Veal ribs come sauteed with artichokes and mushrooms, swordfish is cooked with butter and chives

In short, the food, though good, doesn't get in the way of the show. The show happens about once an hour (more or less), running about 15 minutes per performance. The sets
don't repeat during the evening, so you
can spend the whole night at Verdi and
not have to go through the same piece from Donizetti over and over again. The

range of the programs is, to say the least, highly eclectic. While glancing through the monthly schedule (call the restaurant to get on the mailing list), I found one night filled with operetta favorites and a selection of songs from the Broadway musical "Mack & Mabel"; another night was rich with arias and duets from Verdi, mixed with a tribute Caruso, nights of "Kismet" and "Brigadoon" and evenings that blend the "Barber of Seville" with "Annie Get Your Gun." The singers are good, though it's always a little embarrassing to gnaw on a veal chop while someone warbles his way through Puccini. But then, for Italians, food, music and love have always been one and the same. The masters wouldn't mind your eating
